# COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT OFFICER'S REPORT

## Report to the Social Services Committee – January 2009

### Kaikoura Youth Skills Project

This project is now well underway and has been very successful to date. Andrew Penman the project coordinator has been working hard with young people mainly through the high school at this stage and students from years 7 to 10 have produced and mixed music tracks which are available to listen to on [www.kaikouraallstars.com](http://www.kaikouraallstars.com). The next stage of the project is a Hip Hop dance workshop on the 29<sup>th</sup> and 30<sup>th</sup> of January where participants will put together routines to these tracks. Film workshops will be run during February and participants will put together videos to accompany the tracks.

The Youth Skills project has recently secured the use of the space beneath the Community Gym where practice rooms will be set up and will hopefully encourage young people outside the school system to become involved. The project is well on track and there have been some excellent outcomes to date. A concert band has been formed and is practicing and it is hoped that another band can be set up to participate in the National Rock Quest competition.

The Community Development officer and project Coordinator are currently working on funding applications for year two of this project as well as applications to pub charities for resourcing of equipment.

### Kaikoura Youth Council

The Kaikoura Youth Council had a successful year in 2008 and were involved in a number of events for young people within our community. They intend to kick 2009 off by having a stall at the Waitangi Day Event and are also helping the Mayfair Theatre fundraise with an event there on Friday the 13<sup>th</sup>. They will be starting a recruitment drive at these events to encourage other youth to be involved in community projects. Goals for 2009 include a basketball half court and perhaps extension of the skate park.

### Waitangi Day Event – 2009

Te Tai O Marokura with funding support from the Ministry of Culture and Heritage and the Kaikoura District Council Community Initiatives fund will again be holding an event to mark this day on the evening of February the 5<sup>th</sup> at the start of the Peninsula Walkway in South Bay. There is a great line up of both local and national talent to entertain including participants of the Kaikoura Youth Skills project. The evening starts from 4.30pm and will go to around 8pm. This is a free event and everyone is encouraged to bring along their families and friends and enjoy this evening. There will also be market stalls on site.

### Kaikoura Physical Activity Plan

This plan was adopted by Council in August 2008. A Legacy group formed to oversee the implementation of this plan was formed and met for the first time in November 2008. This group is made up of Kaikoura District Council, Department of Conservation, Tasman Regional Sports Trust, Runanga, Te Tai O Marokura, CDHB HEHA, Hurunui/Kaikoura PHO and local community representatives. Short term actions have been examined and plans put in place to implement these. This includes a recreation coordinator for Kaikoura and a funding application went to the Canterbury Community Trust looking to access some funds for this position. We should know the outcome of this in April this year.

### Labour Market Development Strategy

The Community Development Officer and Tourism and Economic Development Officer have completed an Expression of Interest to Enterprising Communities (Ministry of Social Development) to access funding to complete the above strategy. If this expression of interest is approved then the next

stage is to develop a business plan and application for this funding. This stage of the application process is very time consuming, as it involves a lot of research and community consultation, but it is hoped that it will be completed by November this year so the funding is available to commence work on putting together the actual strategy. It is hoped that funding will be secured for three years. The first year will involve researching and putting together the strategy and the next two years will be implementation of the strategy.

#### Kaikoura Health Facilities

The CDHB held a meeting in Kaikoura December 19<sup>th</sup> to address the issue of the new Health Facility for our community. Mayor Heays was given the opportunity to address the Board and with the help of the Medical Centre and other interested parties a presentation was made which left the Board in no doubt that our community is fully committed to this project and will go to great lengths to see it happen. The Board has endorsed in principle the model of care and asked that the Planning and Funding arm of the CDHB have ready by June 2009 a full business case for this project. The community should expect consultation with the CDHB prior to this time.

#### Family Violence Network and Strengthening Families

Rupia Te Ua coordinator for both FVN and SF has left Kaikoura to travel back to the north island to be closer to her family up in the Bay of Plenty. I would like to acknowledge the hard work and achievements Rupia made in the two roles and wish her all the best for the future.
