Top of the South Film Festival will host a red carpet event and screening at Kaikōura Museum on Saturday 10 November. All proceeds will go to the Mayfair Theatre rebuild. Red carpet event starts 6.30pm and screening starts 7pm. Tickets will be available from the Top of the South website soon.



The Mayfair theatre's historic art deco building first opened its doors on 21 December 1934. It was damaged beyond repair in the 2016 earthquake and fundraising is now underway to rebuild and revamp the theatre.

New fees and charges

All Councils fees and charges, including charges at Innovative Waste (IWK), were reviewed as part of the 3 Year Plan. Where needed, they were changed to make sure that charges cover the cost of the service. This means that what you pay at IWK and for some Council services has now increased. Revaluation

Under NZ law, Council is required to carry out an assessment of the capital value of properties in the Kaikōura District every three years. This is called a revaluation and is carried out independently by Quotable Value (QV). Your new valuation will include any known earthquake damage which needs to be reported by August 31. Either complete the online survey at www.surveymonkey.com/r/QVkaikouraReval or a form available from Council's front desk.

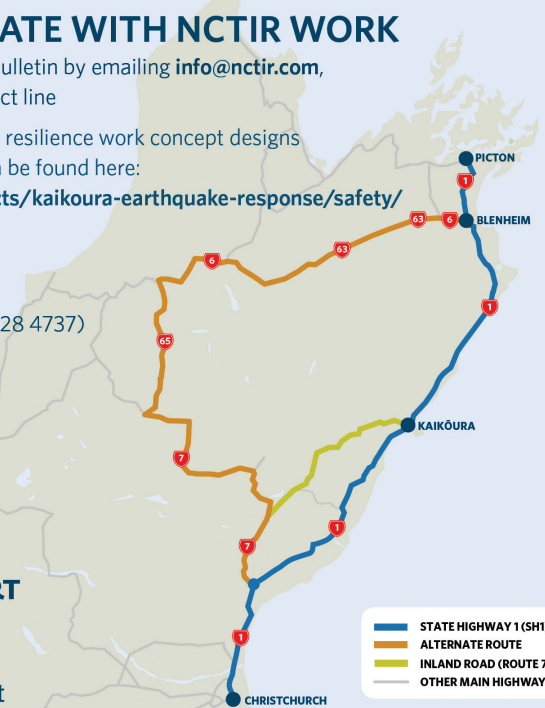
