“World Heritage status has in the past been a top-down process. We are wanting to drive this from the grass roots perspective and celebrating all the incredible mahi our community undertakes to creating a world leading destination, with the environment as the central and guiding pillar to our economic and social wellbeing. It is well known Kaikōura has exceptional natural beauty from the mountains to the sea however there is an even richer, depth, breadth, and diversity that exists with Kaikōura. We have a rich history dating back 800 years that is pivotal to the history of Aotearoa. As part of World Heritage, as a community we are already working towards achieving International Dark Sky Sanctuary status, predator-free status, developing Kaikōura's first enviro-school, creating Kaikōura as Marine Research Centre of Excellence, sharing

history through the Museum including untold stories of Surfing and building a Kaikōura Wildlife Hospital. Kaikoura’s main industries are predominantly farming and tourism. Whilst we celebrate and market singular agritourism businesses, we don’t communicate the environmental initiatives our farmers are taking to protect our surrounding natural assets. Celebrating and telling the story of our agricultural history, from the kumara gardens through to regenerative farming and wetlands development of today is also a key part to World Heritage.”
