Workshop Notes:	<u>Purpose of the workshop/short description:</u> Sports Tasman presented their strategic direction and vision.
	<u>What was discussed:</u> Presentation from Sports Tasman. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Strategy has not been published as yet, framework provided in presentation to give indication of what stage the trust is at. • Data collected from Sport NZ per region is based on school activity – noted hunting isn't captured as a sport but would be in the top 2-3. • Figures are based on the school sport participation. • If the council desires, a community sport participation and regional participation survey can be serviced by Sports Tasman. • Voice of Participant survey is for clubs and compares regions, Voice of Rangatahi could be facilitated with the college and provides broad comparisons. Timing of surveys with schools are important as there is survey fatigue. • Active recreation – Water safety framework – Soraya has engaged with the Council, ECAN and DOC. Waiting to hear from the Runanga and MPI. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ The framework includes maps/signage on safe areas to swim, surf, cultural significance, safe procedures and precautions etc ○ The aim of the framework is to build confidence in the community ○ Soraya is hoping to engage with the schools for signage. • Disability coordinator ran Halberg Inclusion Training with three primary schools and will continue supporting to create a programme. • Sport – aiming to get two student coach workshops at the high school. This will be 'how to coach' and not 'what to coach'. • At High School age Students' preference for inspiration is peer-to-peer success stories rather than celebrities. • Cultural forms of recreation will include how to traditionally prepare seafood at the Marae as an example. This will be a 5–6-week programme.

	<p><u>End Result / Direction from Council/ Actions:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Upcoming opportunities included Play Advocate that are collaborating with KDC in September. 5 of the Play Advocates will meet with students, Runanga, council staff and come back to present ideas on how to make Kaikōura a playful town.• Suggested that Sports Tasman put in a submission for the Reserve Management Plans.
